Putting the Pieces Together for A Noteworthy Tutor Conference

When you mix Dedicated Volunteers with Eager Participants and Knowlegeable, Professional Presenters, you have the recipe for a successful Volunteer Literacy Conference.

The 2016 Tutor Conference included eighteen presenters/moderators in fifteen workshops packed with relevant and practical information. Workshop topics embraced traditional approaches to teaching grammar, reading, and writing, as well as the multi-sensory approach of the Orton-Gillingham method. Additional workshops highlighted Total Physical Response, using media in tutoring, finding and using free online resources, and finding authentic materials to spark student interest in their local community. Conference evaluation comments emphasized the usefulness of ideas and materials that could be used right away.

Students participated in the Culture Exchange Workshop, Pronunciation Workshops, and at the luncheon shared their stories of learning English. Students are a great resource for the conference, reminding us how challenging their journeys have been, and how hard they work every day to learn a new language.
