The Portland Literacy Council (PLC) invites applications for our Community Grants program.

- These grants are available to Portland metro-area literacy programs that advance Adult Basic Education, GED preparation, or English-as-a-Second Language instruction.
- Grants support existing projects or programs, and may cover operational or program expenses.
- Grants are limited to \$500.
- Previous recipients <u>are</u> eligible to apply for the same or another program/project.
- To be eligible, organizations must provide proof of non-profit status.
- Agencies receiving grants must consent to be profiled in LiteracyLinks, PLC's monthly newsletter.
- The deadline for applications to be received is <u>5 PM</u>, November 10, 2014.

A sample of recent community grants include:

- *Street Books*, a bicycle-powered mobile library that serves people who live out-of-doors in the city of Portland. Awarded \$500 to create a fund dedicated to Spanish-language texts, specifically to meet patron requests.
- *Neighborhood House Women's ESL Health Class.* Awarded \$500 to provide books for mothers to read to children during class with teacher support, and to take home to their families.
- *SOAR*, *Sponsors Organized to Assist Refugees*, a program of Ecumenical Ministries of Oregon. Awarded \$250 to help defray copying costs and purchase project supplies.

To apply: Submit a letter (email or hardcopy) describing, in 500 words or less, the literacy project for which funding is requested. Your letter should cover the following information:

- Name of the program or project and the name of the sponsoring organization
- Name and phone number of the person to contact if we have questions about the grant proposal
- Students served
- Project's goals
- How a community grant will advance the project mission

Be sure to include a copy of your organization's <u>IRS 501(c)(3)</u> tax exemption letter or other acceptable evidence of nonprofit status. Applications will not be considered without this documentation.
